Update: BJA Extends Grant

- U.S. Department of Justice Bureau of Justice Assistance announced deadline changes to its *Adult Drug Court and Veterans Treatment Court Discretionary Grant Program*. Applicants are required to complete a new two-step submission process:
- March 31, 2021: The SF-242 and SF-LLL must be submitted to Grants.gov (previous deadline March 3)
- April 14, 2021: The full application must be submitted to JustGrants (previous deadline March 17)
